<u>Electronic Federal Tax Payment System EFTPS</u> EFTPS is a tax payment system provided free by the U.S. Department of Treasury. Pay federal taxes electronically – on-line or by phone 24/7.

<u>Electronic Funds Withdrawal and Credit Card for Businesses</u> Taxpayers who file electronically can e-file and e-pay in a single step by authorizing an electronic funds withdrawal.

<u>Estimated Taxes</u> Federal income tax is a pay-as-you-go tax. You must pay the tax as you earn or receive income during the year. There are two ways to pay as you go: withholding and estimated taxes.

Information Returns Processing Understand your Information Reporting Requirements. Included are help-line telephone numbers and direct links to aid you in reporting information returns. You will also find information about how to file returns electronically or magnetically.

<u>SSA Online Wage Reporting System</u> Register and transmit Forms W-2 to SSA over the Internet.
